

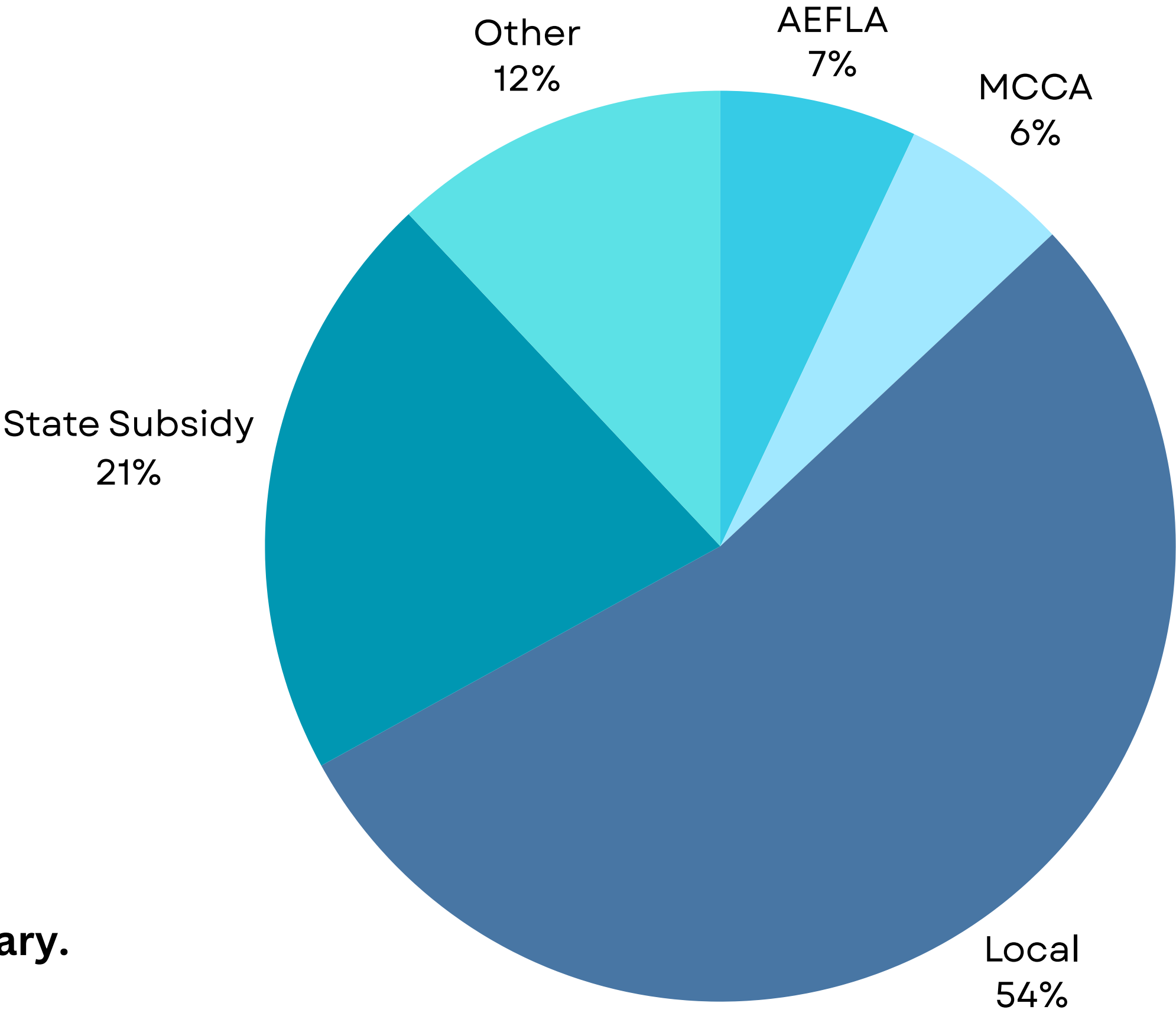

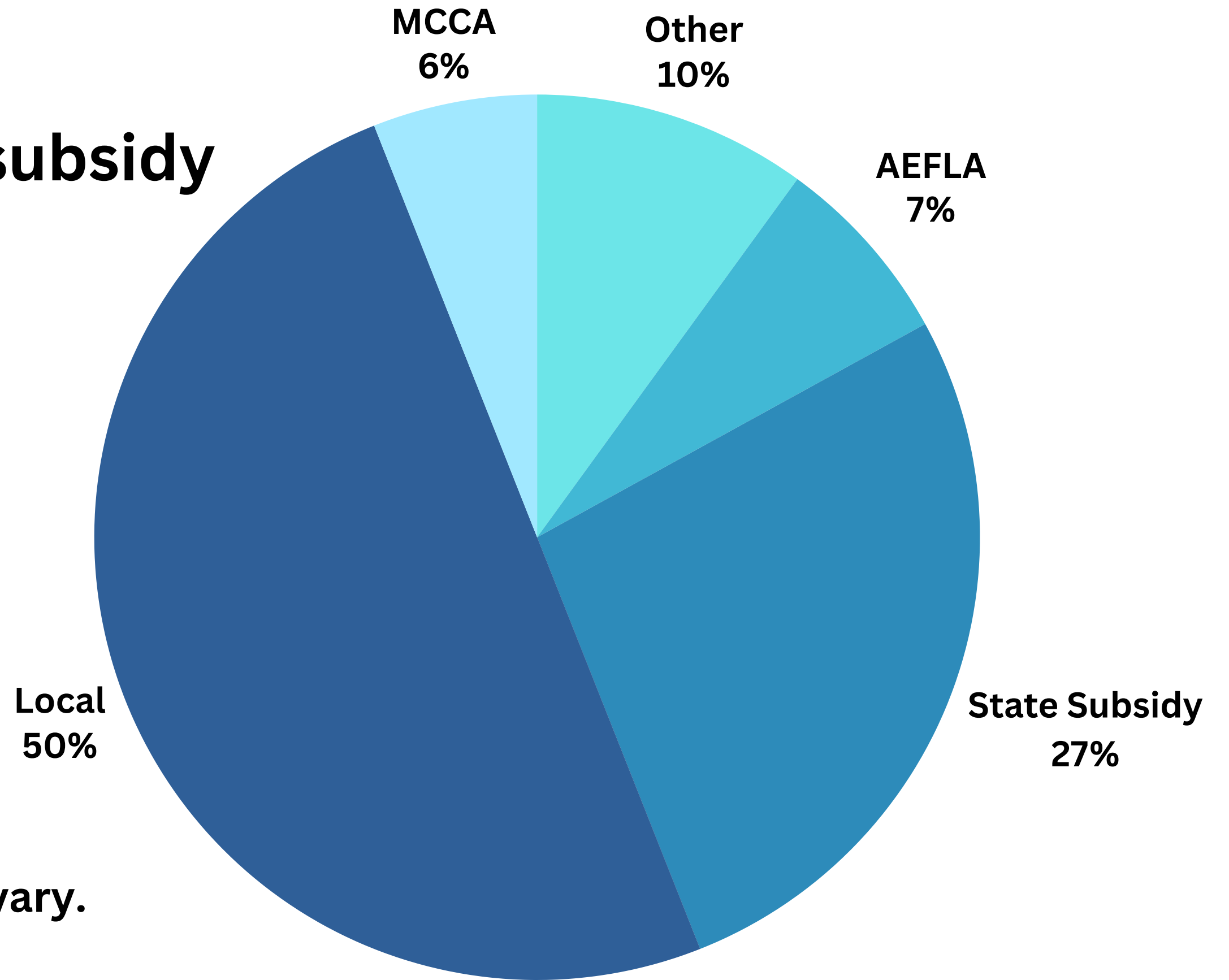

Which Programs Receive Subsidy?

According to Maine law, adult education programs must provide at least three major services to receive subsidy. Major services are basic literacy or English language acquisition, high school completion, college transition, adult workforce training and retraining, and/or adult career and technical education.
