





internationally acclaimed, six-time award-winning Educate and Elevate public awareness campaign, which brought much-needed visibility to the value of adult education and prompted more than 250,000 contacts with legislators at the local, state, and federal levels. Mrs. Bonney currently serves on the board of the National Work Readiness Council and serves on the Leadership Council of the National Small Business Association. She also serves on the US Chamber of Commerce Education and Workforce Board, and serves on numerous adult education boards and committees. She is a recipient of the Stevie Award which recognizes women in business, and is a recipient of the prestigious 2025 Marquis Who's Who Award.
