Olga Djuric-Wilfong has overcome many obstacles in her life. Born and raised in Kosovo, Serbia, she held onto her love of learning despite having to stop school in the eighth grade. Married at sixteen, she raised a family during the Kosovo War.

After starting a new life and family in America in her early thirties, Olga worked at a variety of customer service jobs. She then applied to be a TSA agent and a CNA, but ran into the barrier of not having her high school diploma. Ever determined, Olga discovered she could take classes at Kittery Adult Ed to prepare for the HiSET (high school equivalency tests.)

For the past three years while she continued to work and look after her family, Olga faithfully attended classes and studied at home. A model of perseverance and positivity, Olga’s efforts paid off on June 8 when she graduated high school with a HiSET diploma. Many new opportunities await Olga now. Take a reading and math assessment to help us figure out how to best prepare you for the HiSET.

Get individual teaching support that fits your schedule and learning needs, so you can pass the HiSET as soon as possible.



TAKING THE HISET

Take 5 pretests and 5 HiSET tests: reading, writing, math, social studies, and science. You don't have to take them all at once, and you get more than one try!

EARNING YOUR HISET DIPLOMA

After you've passed all 5 HiSET tests, CONGRATULATIONS, you've earned your high school equivalency diploma. Time to celebrate!

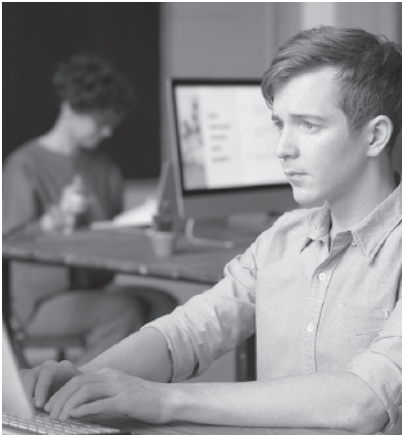

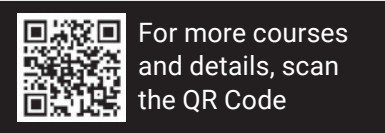

Dental Assisting Program

This 12-week hybrid course taught by a dentist is designed to teach all aspects of dental assisting and prepare you to pass a national certificate exam and includes an opportunity for internships.
